The Westcoast Black Theatre Troupe is bringing an eventful season to a close by celebrating the glory days of the Harlem Renaissance with the Broadway musical "Bubbling Brown Sugar."

Director Harry Bryce describes the show as "an iconic work of African-American theater; one of the first successful musicals on Broadway with a primarily African-American cast."

Conceived by actress Rosetta LaNoire, "Bubbling Brown Sugar" features songs by such writers as Duke Ellington, Count Basie, Cab Calloway, Fats Waller and Eubie Blake, among others. The hit songs include "Sweet Georgia Brown," "Honeysuckle Rose," "Stormy Monday Blues," "Sophisticated Lady," "I Got It Bad" and "God Bless the Child."
